- **Read & Review your Documents completely**
- **Contact your travel agent with questions**
- **Be sure to check any prerequisites to travel for your destination by reviewing the destination requirements. Many destinations are listed on our resources page of our website: www.journeysbytonsoffuntravel.net/resources. If you don't find the needed information, contact your agent**
- **Contact your credit card company to make them aware there may be international charges coming through**
- **Verify your cell phone coverage and data plan usage internationally**
- **Go to your bank and get small bills for tipping**
- **Have your mail and newspaper held**
- **Arrange to have a friend or law enforcement check on your house**
- **Honeymooners- bring a copy of your marriage license or wedding invitation**
- **Medications go in your carry on bag always!**

Be sure to confirm your flight times on the airline website because schedule changes have been very common recently. Arrive at airport as recommended in your travel documents, typically 3 hours in advance of an international flight and 2 hrs in advance of a domestic flight. We are happy to assist you with securing an airport hotel with included parking, so you have less worries about arriving at the airport in a timely manner.

It is important that when traveling internationally, you visit the State Dept website: travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/traveladvisories.html/ to review any travel advisories and necessary documentation. The State Department recommends that all US Citizens enroll in step.state.gov to receive alerts and ensure citizens can be located in an emergency. US Citizens in an emergency should contact the nearest US Embassy or call 1-888-407-4747 or 1-202-501-4444

The Mobile Passport Control app is recommended for those traveling internationally, download on Google Play or Apple App Store

You may be denied boarding if you do not follow recommended guidelines. All liquids in carry-on luggage needs to be less than 3oz and kept in a single quart size ziplock bag, this includes many items that ladies typically carry in their purse: lip gloss, lipstick, hand sanitizer, cologne/perfume, nail polish, etc

For Airline baggage fees and allowed baggage sizes, please visit your airline website. Bag fees will be charged at the airport when you check in and usually must be paid with a debit/credit card. This will happen on your departure and on your return. You don't pay roundtrip for the baggage fees. The last items you pack should be the first things you'll need when you arrive at your destination!!

Carry on luggage sizes may vary by airline, so please visit your airline website for current data. In your carry on bag, be sure to keep any jewelry, valuables, medications and your cell phone charger or supplemental battery pack. Also include an extra outfit of clothes and your swimsuits in case your luggage is not immediately available. All pieces of luggage should have an identifying tags on the outside and inside the bag, air tags are now also becoming increasingly popular to track bag locations.

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You should also pack appropriate clothing for dining at all inclusive resorts and on most cruise ships. Guys are expected to wear long trousers or dress shorts, collared shirt (could be a golf type shirt) and closed toed shoes, as many restaurants require this in the evening. Gals can wear sandals, capris, skirts, pants. Shorts and swimsuits are rarely allowed at sit down restaurants. Ask your travel agent about the specifics for your resort/cruise. If you are traveling in Europe, specifically Italy, most cathedrals require knees and shoulders to be covered for both men and women.

Leave a copy of your travel itinerary with someone at home in case they need to reach you in an emergency. We recommend taking a photo of your passport or ID to keep on your phone in case of theft/loss. This would make replacement easier. Be sure to have your travel insurance & medical insurance details readily available during travel and make sure your friend/family member/travel partner are aware of your coverages, in case of illness or injury.

A credit card is typically required by hotel/cruise line to be on file for incidental charges even when your booking is paid in full.

If your flight is cancelled, please keep copies of any notifications you receive or original boarding passes and new boarding passes as we have found these to be very useful in filing insurance claims. Also, know the contents of your checked bag in case it gets lost, airlines will want to know the value to reimburse you.

Always be aware of your surroundings, and keep your safety in mind at all times, traveling domestically and abroad. If you have an all inclusive plan that includes alcohol please be mindful of consumption. If you plan to venture off property, make sure you do so with a vetted transportation/excursion provider.
